 - ² FPPC regulations and West Covina Municipal Code § 2-401 requires full disclosure of campaign donations of \$100 or more (itemized). Donations of less than \$100 may be totaled and reported as one amount received during a designated reporting period (unitemized). Donations of less than \$100 are not included in this chart.
 - ³ West Covina Municipal Code § 2-402 limits campaign contributions to a maximum dollar amount per election per calendar year. The limit is automatically adjusted on January 1 of odd numbered years according to the Consumer Price Index established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics for the Los Angeles, Riverside, and Orange County areas. The City of West Covina website states the current contribution limit is \$530.99.
 - 4 West Covina Municipal Code § 2-405.1 prohibits applicants or contractors from making any contributions to individuals already elected to office.
 - 5 Election to office does not stop reporting requirements. Reporting requirements stop when the committee is terminated.
 - ⁶ Gutierrez reported one business contribution and no individual contributions received. On Schedule B. Loans Received he reports loaning his campaign an accumulated total of \$13,000.
 - 7 Rozzati reports one campaign banner received as a nonmonetary contribution.
 - 8 Shewmaker reports no contributions or loans received. On Schedule F, Accrued Expenses (Unpaid Bills) one items is listed: \$3,224.33 for literature owed to John Shewmaker.
